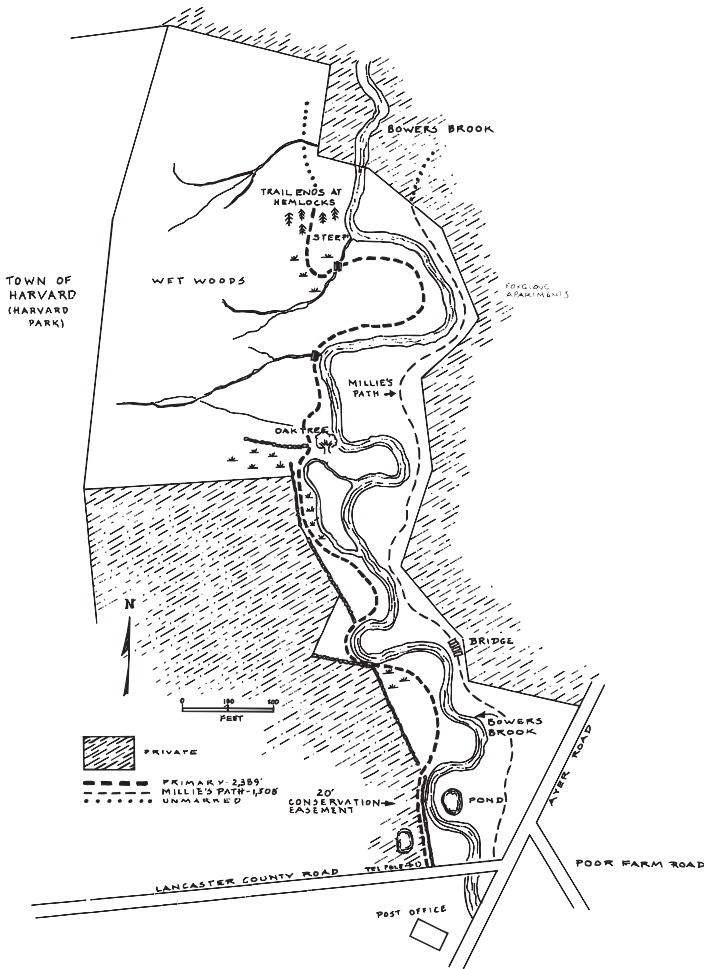


MAXANT LAND



This 19 acre property was a gift to the town from Ted Maxant in exchange for permission to rezone a small piece of land from agricultural/residential to commercial.

The trail follows the winding course of Bowers Brook through some hardwoods and wetlands passing interesting spring flora and currently ends on a hill in a hemlock grove. Millie's Path was developed through community efforts in order to provide a safe route for the residents of Foxglove apartments to the post office (formerly Carlson's Orchards farm stand). It was named in honor of Millie Henry whose son Michael was instrumental in planning the path. Millie's Path following the east side of the brook is higher and drier with an overlook of the brook and the Maxant trail. Entrance is through the field at the Ayer Road corner or from the parking lot at Foxglove.

Approx. walking time for Maxant trail: 35 mins. - difficult terrain/not suitable for horses
 Approx. walking time for Millie's Path: 10 mins. - easy, benches for resting
